

China Economic Policy Review

Call for Papers

The Research Center for International Economics (RCIE) at the **University of International Business and Economics**, and the Department of Economics, **Hong Kong Baptist University** are planning to publish review articles on China's economic policies. The first issue is scheduled to appear in 2009.

The Review welcomes articles that review, analyze, criticize, and/or appraise current and previous economic policies of China. Articles to be considered by the Review can focus on the economic and political impacts of economic policies on the Chinese and other economies of the world, or on the economic relations between China and the rest of the world. Articles to be considered also include those that investigate how the Chinese government should react to changing economic situations in the world and in the Chinese economy. Articles that examine the policy interactions between China and other countries or international economic organizations (WTO, IMF, World Bank, and so on) are also highly welcome.

The Review plans to publish articles that interest both the general public, policy makers, and economists.

There will be two types of articles: long ones and short ones. Long ones (approximately ten to fifteen typed pages, double space, and a font size of 12 points) have analysis and conclusions usually based on research of the authors and should cite some of the author's (working or published) work and results, although the proofs and technical analysis can be omitted. Short ones (approximate five to ten pages) are those that do not need to be based on existing papers of the authors, and are usually analysis of policies related to more current issues.

Authors can submit papers in either English or Chinese or both. Accepted papers will be translated into Chinese or English, if needed, and they will be published both in English and Chinese.

There is no submission fee.
